

# Ohio Cancer Plan 2021 – 2030

## Cancer Plan Revision Guiding Document

### Context

The purpose of this work is to revise the Ohio Comprehensive Cancer Plan.

The Cancer Plan identifies how the state cancer coalition (Ohio Partners for Cancer Control (OPCC)) and other stakeholders will address the burden of cancer in Ohio. It is designed to serve as a blueprint for action. This will be Ohio’s fourth Cancer Plan.

The Plan must:

- Be in place by Jan 1, 2021
- Engage stakeholders in the development, implementation and evaluation
- Include CDC/NCCCCP priority areas: 1) Primary prevention of cancer, 2) Early detection and treatment, 3) Supporting cancer survivors and caregivers, 4) Building healthy communities through PSE change, 5) Health equity, and 6) Demonstrating outcomes through evaluation

### Guiding principles

Ohio is committed to creating a Cancer Plan that is:

- Data driven
- Includes measurable goals
- Attends to equity
- Aligns with existing statewide and federal efforts
- Includes perspectives of diverse stakeholders
- Is evidence-based
- Is aesthetically pleasing and easy to understand
